Twelve actions to help YOU!!

Locum pharmacists are an important part of the workforce – it is essential that they are able to play their role in making the New Medicine Service a success for patients and pharmacy.

These changes will provide patients with a further level of support to those that are currently commissioned and will support the NHS in its endeavour to ensure optimum value from the £12bn investment in medicines. This is a highly significant opportunity, based on evidence, to develop the role of the community pharmacist and to demonstrate the value of the profession and its unique ability to address the issue of non-adherence. These developments have the ability to strengthen the links between hospital and community pharmacy to improve patient care in relation to medicines optimisation.

Everyone must play their part to support implementation and ensure success: primary care trusts, community pharmacists and their teams, GPs, patients, secondary care, the Department of Health and pharmacy organisations.
